If you are aged 16-19 and study a course with ATTFE College you may be eligible for a bursary!

A bursary is an amount of money that doesn't have to be paid back. Its aim is to help you pay for things you need to complete your course, including specialist clothing, books and other equipment you need, transport to college, and lunch on the days you study.

About this Course

At Level 2:

You will learn the basics of what it is like to work in a business environment. This involves a combination of classroom study and practical work-based experience. You cover a range of topics relating to the sector such as customer service, digital literacy and communication skills.



At Level 3:

Learners complete mandatory units in communicating in business environments; managing personal and professional development; the principles of business; principles of administration; principles of business information. Learners then choose from a range of more specialised contextualised units that align to the duties of their role, including contributing to the improvement of business performance; delivering a presentation; managing an office facility; monitoring information systems; participating in a project; managing individuals' development in the workplace; principles of leadership and management; chairing and leading meetings.

Assessment

This course is assessed through a portfolio of evidence and observation of practice in a work environment.

Destinations

These courses support the development of transferable skills that would be beneficial to further study in similar subjects. Those who complete the Level 3 Diploma could choose to progress to Level 4 in Business Administration or develop their knowledge further by studying Business Management at Level 3. Ultimately, all courses support employment prospects in Business Administration roles.

About These Qualifications:

The AIM Qualification provides learners with opportunities to develop their skills and knowledge around building a career in a range of business administration and customer service industries. Developed in conjunction with employers, training providers and subject matter experts, this suite of qualifications truly reflects the knowledge, skills and understanding which individuals require when employed in either a business administration or customer service role.

The Pearson BTEC allows learners to demonstrate a practiced set of skills in business administrative operations, including developing and managing administrative systems, processes and functions. It develops learners' understanding of administrative environments, the principles business and the broader, cross organisational processes that an administrator must understand.

About These Qualifications:

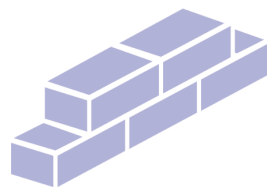
These qualifications focus on helping learners to develop practical workplace skills in their specific subject area, with the ultimate aim of pursuing a career in the trade of their choice.

Though the teaching will be practical and skills based, there will be theory elements to support the practical work. Learners will develop specialised skills that will facilitate their transition into the workplace, with the potential to progress to management and oversee roles.

About this Course

Property Maintenance Operations

Learners explore the mechanisms of buildings including electrical, plumbing, plant, safety systems and equipment. They learn how to provide first and immediate response to fault finding, ensuring the prevention of major damage and minimising reactive intervention.



Bricklaying, Site Carpentry & Painting and Decorating

Learners carry out work experience with an external company, allowing them to put their classroom skills into practice. This can help secure an apprenticeship, employment or assist you with your application for university. We recommend that you start thinking about your placement as soon as you have applied for your course, considering which potential employers you may want to undertake the placement with to help you get the most out of the experience.

Assessment

These courses are assessed by online assessment and a portfolio of evidence detailing practical tasks.

Destinations

These courses support learners who wish to move into a trade career, either employed or self-employed. Learners who complete their courses can look into completing further qualifications at higher levels or moving into further specialised areas, such as plumbing, electrics or facilities management.



About this Course

Learners studying foundation courses will have the opportunity to develop their knowledge of their chosen subject, whilst considering how to start their career path into their chosen industry. All courses involve strong practical elements of learning that encourage our learners to increase not only their theoretical studies but their experience in workplace environments.



Assessment

These courses are all assessed through a portfolio of evidence; some also require an online assessment.

Destinations

All courses support the development of subject-specific skills, allowing learners to progress to higher-level qualifications in their chosen area of study. Alternatively, learners who complete these qualifications gain the skills necessary to move into the workplace and pursue careers in these trades.

About These Qualifications:

These foundation courses are designed to enable learners to access vocational qualifications from Entry Level 1 through to Level 2, depending on their level of learning. They can also complete varying sizes of qualifications at each level, from Award through to Diploma. Being able to build up achievement in incremental stages can help support intrinsic motivation for learners, whilst developing character education.

About These Qualifications:

Our light vehicle qualifications are nationally recognised, vocational and vocationally-related qualifications which allow learners to demonstrate that their knowledge, skills and competence are of the standard required to work in the motor industry. They are designed to help you build and showcase your skillset within this sector and cover areas such as the inspection, maintenance, repair and servicing of light vehicles.

The Level 2 qualification is aimed at learners who wish to develop understanding and skills in the building, servicing, repair and maintenance of cycles. This qualification also suits individuals with a keen leisure interest in cycles.

About this Course

The programme of our Vehicle Maintenance courses involves learners studying both the theory and practical aspects of the essential knowledge and skills required by today's motor vehicle repair industry.

Learners also gain a broad knowledge and understanding of health and safety in the workplace and other skills associated with working in a garage.

Our Cycle Maintenance course offers learners practical study of all aspects of maintenance and repair, including completing a cycle check, puncture repairs, removal and replacement of gear assembly, rim brake assembly, hub bearings, bottom brackets, cranks and gear systems, building a cycle wheel, preparing frames and forks, augmenting a cycle, changing a cycle frame, and servicing headset assemblies.



Assessment

These courses are assessed by a combination of written and practical tests, as well as online assessment.

Destinations

These qualifications have the potential to provide useful recognition of learners' professional competence, which may aid them in securing jobs and progression in to the vehicle and cycle maintenance industries. They may also provide a stepping stone to further education, potentially at degree level.



About this Course

These courses are ideal for those with an interest in the areas of hair and beauty, who are looking to develop their practical skills, knowledge and techniques.

Learners will have the chance to work in our bespoke hair salon and beauty therapy rooms. We offer our services to the general public, giving you the opportunity to experience a genuine work environment. Here you will practice all elements of your course under the supervision of our fully trained tutors.



Assessment

These courses are all assessed through a learner portfolio evidencing your practical work, in addition to online assessment.

Destinations

Our lower level courses can support learners with little or no experience in developing their knowledge and practical skills. From there, they will be able to progress to our higher level qualifications. Learners who complete a Level 3 qualification can consider further studies, apprenticeships or employment in the beauty therapy industry.

About These Qualifications:

Our certificates and diplomas are designed to build on your interest and passion for the hair and beauty industry, covering a wide range of skills from styling, plaiting and twisting to make-up or nail art.

We offer a range of courses at various levels to suit learners at all stages of study. Lower level courses will prepare learners for higher level study, from which they can move on to apprenticeships or the workplace.

About These Qualifications:

These qualifications will develop the learner's knowledge and awareness of the types of provision in the Health, Social Care and Children's and Young People's sectors. They include the roles played by workers—from principles and values, through to health and safety and working with others.

About this Course

The Health and Social Care courses prepare learners for working in the Health and Social Care sector.

Level 1 comprises of a mixture of core and optional units and learners are required to complete assessments for each unit.

Level 2 comprises of a mixture of core and optional units and learners are required to complete assessments for each unit.

Level 3 (Yr 1) comprises of 9 core units. Learners must complete assessments for all units and also sit a controlled synoptic assessment that is set and marked by the awarding body.

Level 3 (Yr 2) comprises of 5 core units and 4 optional units. Learners must complete assessments for all units and sit a controlled assessment that is set and marked by the awarding body. This synoptic assessment is based on the core units for the second year.

Learners will study a range of units, with examples being equality and diversity, communication and safeguarding. Learners will also be required to complete a minimum number of work experience hours. Work experience can take place in a variety of health and social care settings (e.g. nurseries, care homes, health centres and hospitals). A clear DBS is required to undertake these courses.

Assessment

These courses may assess learners through a portfolio of evidence, practical workplace observation and online assessment.

Destinations

Progression from these courses will vary. Learners can enter employment as a care assistant or support worker. If learners are wanting to progress to become a recognised practitioner (e.g. nurse or social worker) they will need to complete L3 in order to enter university.



About this Course

The primary purpose of this qualification is to prepare you to enter employment in the Uniformed Services sector.



This qualification is designed to give you a good insight into the practical activities which the uniformed services require. You will research and visit a range of extended uniformed services, developing a broad understanding of the uniformed services sector, investigating employment opportunities, developing wellbeing, physical fitness and self-discipline, building teamworking skills, and understanding health and safety.

Optional units may provide opportunities to carry out map reading and navigation, explore volunteering opportunities, participate in competitive sport and take part in adventurous activities.

Assessment

These courses are assessed through a portfolio of evidence and observation of work-based practice.

Destinations

Learners who achieve at Level 1 might consider progression to Level 2 qualifications in areas such as Entry to the Uniformed Services, Outdoor Activity Leadership, Team Leading, Sport and Public Services.

Successful completion of the Level 2 course could lead to employment in a number of job roles in the uniformed services, which include the Army, Navy, RAF, Ambulance Service, Fire and Rescue Service, Police, Coastguard, Prison Service and more. Level 3 learners may have the option to progress to higher education study.

About These Qualifications:

These qualifications aim to provide informed and prepared potential recruits. They enable learners to prepare to make a recruitment application or provide a basis for further Study and progression towards the entry qualification of a specific service, providing learners with an insight into the practical qualities they require, not only for uniformed services, but also for employment in general.

About These Qualifications:

The Level 1 course is designed for learners who like working with children, want to pursue a career in Early Years and are looking to gain the skills to achieve this.

The Level 2 Certificate focuses on the emotional wellbeing of children and young people, their development, milestones and education.

The Level 3 childcare qualification is the leading standard in early years' education. Set against the Early Years Foundation Stages (EYFS) framework, it provides key training to work with children below the age of 5, as well as an in-depth understanding of youngsters up to 7 years old. For those looking to train in Early Years Education, this is the ideal qualification.

About this Course

In all our childcare courses, you'll learn about the growth and development of young children, job roles within Early Years Education and how to provide activities to help children develop. You will also gain personal learning skills, an awareness of equality, health and safety, and communication. Learners receive great tuition and support throughout the course, which will include a variety of coursework and case studies. At higher levels, learners focus on safeguarding the welfare of children, exploring how early learning and healthy diet play an important role in the developmental, emotional and physical wellbeing of children, as well as exploring the various accident prevention and fire safety methods.

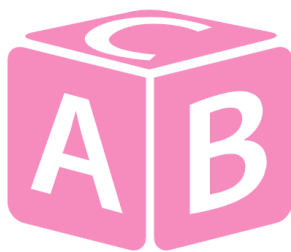
At Level 3, you'll learn how to meet all of the physical, social, and emotional needs of children under 5 whilst also gaining knowledge of how best to work with children aged 5-7. You'll explore how to support a healthy lifestyle through nutrition and exercise, how to promote children's speech and language skills, as well as gaining other vital knowledge regarding safeguarding and health and safety legislation.

Assessment

These courses are assessed by an online assessment and a portfolio of work based evidence.

Destinations

Learners who complete their courses can progress directly to courses at higher levels of study or transfer to the workforce to pursue a career in Early Years Education. Higher level courses may help learners secure supervisory or management positions.
