We are proud to share that our Executive Senior Leader, **Simon Martin**, has been awarded an **MBE in the 2025 King's Birthday Honours List** for **Services to Further Education**.

This is an outstanding achievement, not only for Simon personally, but also for the education, support, and regeneration work that ATTFE College is passionately committed to both locally and across the **East Midlands Combined County Authority (EMCCA)** region.



In addition to his work at ATTFE College, Simon is actively involved in **governance**, **safeguarding**, **and policy development** within the region (e.g., with Nottinghamshire schools and MATs) and at a national level (e.g., through HOLEX and other

organisations). This award is a well-deserved recognition of his wider contributions, both individually and on behalf of ATTFE College.

Simon shared:

Reach for the Stars at Sherwood Observatory

Guests arrived to warm hospitality, light refreshments and the opportunity to explore the unique venue, including the newly developed Changing Places facility. The event officially opened with speeches in the observatory's café, introduced by Simon Martin and Steve Wallace. The highlight of the address came from **Liz Barrett OBE DL**, Principal of ATTFE College, who shared the college's ambitious #InThisTogether vision and its commitment to transforming lives through further education.

Renowned educationalist and keynote speaker **Dame Ann Limb DBE DL** delivered a powerful message about the importance of inclusion, aspiration and working together to create real, sustainable impact.

A key part of the event was the **Stakeholder Awards Presentation**, celebrating outstanding individuals and organisations making a difference in their communities:

The celebration continued with the official opening of the **Changing Places** facility, enhancing accessibility and inclusion across the site.

Guests were then treated to a unique **Planetarium Presentation**, immersing attendees in the wonders of space – a fitting end to an event themed around aspiration, growth and "reaching for the stars."

Closing remarks brought the event to a heartfelt conclusion, reaffirming ATTFE College's unwavering mission to empower communities through education and opportunity.





Community Celebration on Sutton Lawn!

A joyful celebration took place on Sutton Lawn on 8th May 2025 to mark the 80th anniversary of Victory in Europe (VE) Day.

The **RAF** took to the skies above the park where around 3000 people attended including many local primary schools, making it the largest event in Nottinghamshire on the day and the only one to have a special appearance, of a **Supermarine Spitfire** and a **Hawker Hurricane**, much to the amazement of people of Ashfield and the local community.

The VE Day celebratory event saw exhibitions, as well as wartime song and dance performances from local schools. Making a spectacular event seeing the joy and appreciation on the faces of young and old.

Some veterans and Standard bearers stood to attention for the National Anthem as the park was filled with song.

Before the flypast all were entertained on the lawn and addressed by an very realistic actor delivering the famous "Churchill speech".

The flyover took place precisely at 4.59pm and saw both RAF aircraft fly over the park three times to the amazement and delight of the visitors, seeing the icons of World War II in action and letting them reflect on the sacrifices taken.

It was a fitting tribute to those who fought for the freedom we all enjoy today, but also a powerful reminder of the resilience and unity that have defined our country ever since.

The ATTFE College not only hosted the event but invited around 100 special community guests to a seated afternoon tea on the Lawn, these included **Lord Lieutenant of Nottinghamshire**, **Professor Veronica Pickering MBS HAC** with her four Deputy Lord Lieutenant's, the **High Sheriff of Nottinghamshire**, **Ed Attenborough DL** and many council leaders and College Governors to name a few.

Liz Barrett, principal at the ATTFE College, said, "We are so lucky to have had the RAF Battle of Britain Memorial Flight flypast today on Sutton Lawn and such an amazing way for the local community to get together to celebrate this wonderful occasion. "On behalf of ATTFE College, I would like to express my thanks to everyone involved and to the people of Sutton in Ashfield and the local community for attending this fantastic event"

Funding Opportunities



Family Fund

Grants are now available to support children and young people in the UK experiencing a crisis or emergency.

The grants which are made available through the BBC Children in Need Emergency Essentials programme support families with children up to the age of 17 who are living with financial, health and social difficulties by providing items that meet children's most basic needs, such as kitchen appliances, furniture, baby equipment, beds, clothing, and other items and services that are critical to children's wellbeing. Applications must come through a registered referral agency supporting the family or young person.

The programme is delivered by Family Fund Business Services, and applications can be made at any time. Further information on how you can become a referral organisation is here:

Climate Action Fund

Charities, community groups, not-for-profits, public bodies, schools, and cooperatives can apply for grants that support initiatives that link climate action to people's daily lives and interests.

The grants will support community-led projects that connect climate action with everyday concerns while fostering collaboration across diverse sectors, including arts, sports, policy engagement, and work with underrepresented groups.

The funding is being made available through the National Lottery's £20 million Climate Action Fund – Our Shared Future. Applications must be submitted by partnerships involving a mix of eligible organisations. Grants start at £500,000, with most awards ranging from £1 million to £1.5 million over three to five years.

A limited number of larger or longer-term projects may also receive funding, with up to 25 projects expected to be supported in total.

The fund is open until later in 2025, with the final application deadline to be confirmed. More information is here:

Physics education grants

Grants of up to £5,000 are available to schools, colleges and charities who wish to carry out projects that support the teaching and learning of physics.

The Ogden Trust's Physics Education Grants programme will award grants for projects centred on physics and developed with current evidence in mind, potentially offering partial funding for general science projects with a clear physics component.

The funding can be used to provide curriculum support for students aged 11 to 18, as well as enrichment activities for students aged 4 to 18 from under-represented groups. Applicants must be based in the UK and working predominantly in England.

There is one round of funding each term, and the next closing date for applications is the 22nd June 2025. More information is here:
